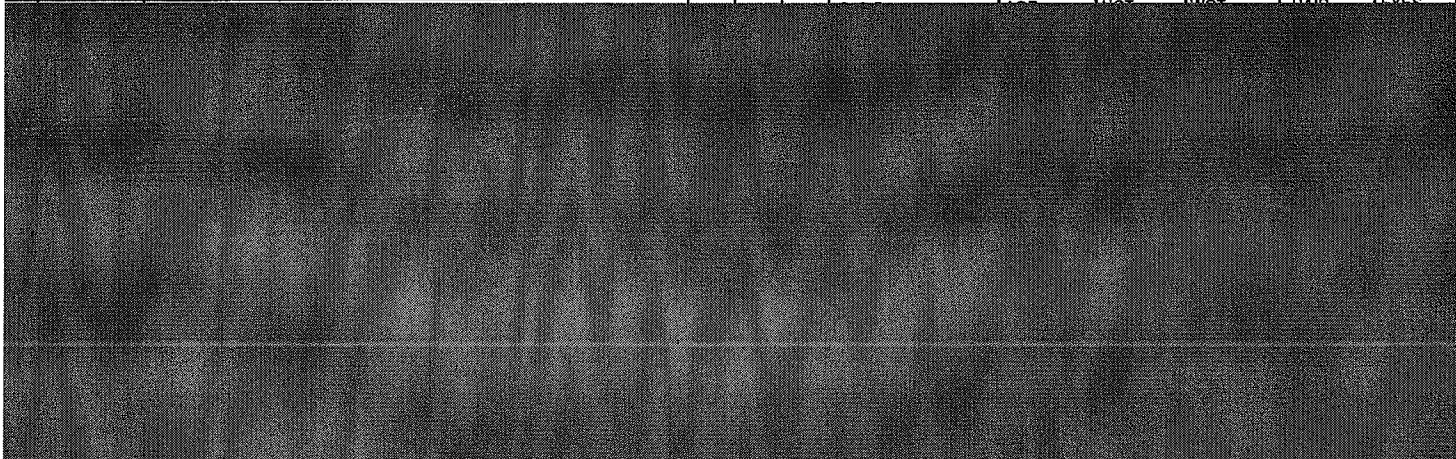

On 10/27/07 at 0815 hours I was contacted by Lt. McGovern who requested that I respond to the Public Safety Building for a briefing reference an extortion.

At 0900 hours I was briefed by Lt. McGovern and Major Roberts.

At 1000 hours I contacted Det. Burbridge and requested that he assist in this case. Det. Madsen had been assigned this case on 10/26/07 and was also present.

At 1215 hours Det. Madsen and I contacted [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. Also present at that address was [REDACTED] Deena Castagna. Det. Madsen had previously interviewed [REDACTED] and at this time told [REDACTED] that he had follow up questions to that interview. Both Deena Castagna and I were present when Det. Madsen told [REDACTED] that he was not under arrest, not in custody and no matter what happened would not be arrested on this date. Det. Madsen did say we were investigating a crime which would be forwarded to the Prosecutors Office. [REDACTED] agreed to speak with us. The interview was conducted on the outdoor back deck of the residence. Although Deena Castagna came out onto the deck several times to speak with [REDACTED] and to ask him if he was sure he wanted to continue the interview, she was not present for the majority of the questioning.

Det. Madsen offered [REDACTED] the option of having his interview recorded either by video or by audio tape recording and Cody declined, saying he was more comfortable talking us without being recorded.

The interview was concluded at 1412 hours. Det. Madsen had asked [REDACTED] for [REDACTED] telephone during the interview. Det. Madsen told [REDACTED] that we were seizing the telephone as evidence and requested search consent from [REDACTED] to obtain the information in the telephone. [REDACTED] agreed and signed a search waiver consent card.

Det. Madsen and I left that residence at 1416 hours.

At 1525 hours Det. Madsen and I attempted to make contact at [REDACTED] which is the residence of Joey Castagna. No one answered the door and a card was left requesting that Det. Madsen be called.

At 1915 hours Det. Burbridge and I drove by [REDACTED] and observed there were no lights on inside the residence. We did observe there was a subject inside the closed business of Dolly's Café. There were also no lights on in the business. I parked my vehicle in a location to observe the restaurant and after approximately five minutes observed a male subject leave through the front door of the restaurant. Det. Burbridge and I contacted the subject who identified himself as Brandon Burchell. I was aware that Burchell had not been honest with Det. Madsen on 10/26/07 and therefore detained him for further questioning. Due to the fact that my vehicle is an unmarked undercover vehicle with no shield, Burchell was [REDACTED] transportation to the Public Safety Building.

In the Major Crimes Unit, Burchell was [REDACTED] placed in an interview room. At 1930 hours I accompanied Det. Madsen and was present when Det. Madsen [REDACTED]

On 10/28/07 at approximately 1100 hours I telephoned Richard Curtis. Curtis asked me what ██████████ said had happened. I told Curtis ██████████ claimed that Curtis said he would give ██████████ \$1,000 for allowing Curtis to perform "bareback" sex on the suspect. ██████████ also said Curtis gave ██████████ his billfold as collateral until Curtis paid the \$1,000.

It should be noted that Curtis had previously denied offering ██████████ any money for sex. He also previously denied having unprotected anal sex (bareback) with ██████████ when I had interviewed Curtis on 10/27/07 over the phone.

Curtis told me that he believed he had been slipped some type of drug because he does not have a clear recollection of the activities that evening. Curtis first said he thought ██████████ was lying about Curtis giving ██████████ his billfold and the bareback sex. Curtis then stated he was so out of it he really didn't know what happened.

I asked Curtis why he had been in Spokane on 10/26/07. Curtis stated he was here on business. I asked Curtis what kind of business and Curtis said he had talked to his attorney who had advised Curtis not to talk to me any further. Curtis stated he did not want to be impolite but thought I had better talk to his attorney. Curtis said he did not understand why anything further was being done on this case and he felt like he was being treated as the suspect.

I asked Curtis who his attorney was and he stated he could not find the business card and he could not recall his attorney's name. I told Curtis once he found his attorney's name and information he could leave it on my voice mail.

On 10/28/07 I was reviewing the phone log on ██████████ cell phone. I only saw one entry showing a phone number with a 360 area code. The phone number was ██████████. The call was an incoming call dated 10/24/07. This would be the same area code as Richard Curtis' cell phone. The phone number was different than any number Curtis had given me. I called the phone number, ██████████. It was a cell phone belonging to Steven Easterly, ██████████ 83. Easterly stated he did not know ██████████. He also said he did not know Richard Curtis. He thought maybe a friend of his had borrowed his cell phone to call ██████████.

Steven Easterly told me that he resided at [REDACTED] in Spokane, WA. The reason his cell phone had a 360 area code was because he had moved to Spokane from the Vancouver, WA area. Easterly had no knowledge of this incident.

On 10/28/07 I talked to Leslie "Jo" McBride at the Holiday Gas Station in the 9700 block of N. Division. She gave me a video cassette from the surveillance cameras for 10/26/07. I had her check the time clock and she advised that the date was correct but the clock was running approximately four minutes faster than my watch, which showed the correct current time. I placed the video cassette into property as evidence.

On 10/26/07 Lt. Dave McGovern requested that I investigate a possible extortion involving reported victim Richard Lyn Curtis. Curtis was reportedly a member of the Washington State House of Representatives. Curtis had sexual relations with a male while staying at the Davenport Towers, located at 111 S. Post. The male suspect reportedly stole Curtis' billfold and was threatening to report their homosexual activities unless he was paid \$1,000.

Lt. McGovern and I met Richard Curtis and Sgt. Ken Wade of the Washington State Patrol at the Davenport Towers. I was introduced to Curtis and advised him that I had been assigned to investigate this incident. Curtis stated he only wanted his wallet back and wanted to keep the incident as low key as possible. He did not want to pursue charges.

Curtis stated that on 10/26/07 at approximately 0100 hours he drove to the Hollywood Erotic Boutique at 9611 E. Sprague. While he was there, a white male with short brown hair, about 5'10 to 6', slender with possible stubble on his face, in his mid to late 20's, bummed a cigarette from Curtis. He asked Curtis if Curtis was a cop and asked if he wanted to get together. Curtis said he told the male he would not pay for sex because that would be prostitution. He told the male he would give the male \$100 to "help him out for gas." He also gave the male some cigarettes. He told the male he didn't care if they got together and had sex or not. Curtis ultimately gave the male his cell phone number of [REDACTED] and told the male to call him if he wanted to get together later. Curtis did not give the male any money at that time.

Curtis stated while he was in the Hollywood Erotic Boutique, he talked to the female employee. She gave him her name, Jalene, and phone number of 443-

4805. Curtis stated that the female could confirm he offered to give the male \$100 to help him out and there should be video inside the Hollywood Erotic Boutique verifying his contact with the suspect and it may include their conversation.

Curtis stated he left the Hollywood Erotic Boutique in his white Honda and drove to Northern Quest Casino. At about 0300 hours he received a call on his cell phone from the male he had met at the Hollywood Erotic Boutique. The male asked him if he wanted to get together and they agreed to meet at the Davenport Towers Hotel. Curtis drove to the Davenport Towers where he met the male after he saw the male walk away from a blue sedan which was parked outside the hotel. The male was alone. Curtis did not recall what clothing the male was wearing and never knew his name.

Curtis stated both he and the male walked into the lobby together. He told the male again that he would give the male \$100 to help him out but he was not paying him to have sex. Curtis and the male went up to Curtis' room, which was 968. Once in the room, Curtis gave the male \$100. While they were in the room, they both had a bottle of Propel fitness water. Curtis and the male ultimately had anal intercourse on the bed in Curtis' hotel room. The male performed intercourse on Curtis and the male's semen and/or DNA would be on the inside of the condom while Curtis' DNA would be on the exterior. Curtis stated he was the person who received the anal sex.

Curtis stated he went to sleep with the male. Curtis woke up alone a little before 0700 hours and he received a phone call from the male. The male told Curtis he had Curtis' wallet and knew he was a state legislator and married. The male claimed to have taken explicit photos of Curtis while Curtis was asleep. The male threatened to publicly release this information unless Curtis gave the male \$1,000. Curtis looked for his billfold and discovered it had been taken from his jacket. Curtis kept his money separate from his billfold. Inside his billfold however was his driver's license, business ID and a Bank One credit card in Curtis' name. He described his billfold as a bi-fold style, black in color with a yellow interior.

Curtis stated he agreed to give the male an additional \$200 in an envelope, if he got his wallet back. Curtis stated he went to the front desk and got a Davenport Hotel envelope from the hotel staff. Curtis waited in the lobby and ultimately gave the envelope containing \$200 to hotel registration staff with a name the male told him to write on the envelope. He didn't remember the name. A second

white male picked up the envelope. He described the second white male as having short brown hair, about the same size as the first white male with a scruffy mustache. The second white male took the envelope and walked out of the lobby. He got into the same blue sedan he had seen the first male in the previous evening. As the vehicle drove away, Curtis wrote down the license number, Washington license [REDACTED]

Curtis stated he talked to a friend in the Washington State Patrol. Curtis said he wanted the Washington State Patrol to investigate the incident because the local police would talk and it would get out to the press.

I told Curtis that I wanted to collect evidence in this case so that it could be secured in case it was ever needed in the future. If he wished no further action taken, I would still have any critical evidence in case he changed his mind or the suspect continued to threaten Curtis in the future. I told Curtis that the toothpaste was already out of the tube. Curtis told me he was just trying to "put the cap back on the tube." I told Curtis that the suspect may victimize other people in the future and Curtis acknowledged that part of his job was to protect people in the State of Washington. Lt. McGovern told Curtis no matter what happened, we would have to document the case in report form regardless of whether or not the case was prosecuted. Curtis said he wished he would have just paid the additional money to the suspect because he didn't wish the case to be prosecuted. If the incident became public it could cost him his marriage and career.

While Lt. McGovern, Sgt. Wade and I were talking to Curtis, Curtis received a call on his cell phone at 1139 hours. Curtis tipped the phone so that I could hear the conversation. I heard a male voice telling Curtis he was on his way back into town and that he wanted Curtis to leave \$800 in the last flower pot on the west side Washington St. Bridge at the far north end. He stated he would be there in 25 minutes to pick up the money. Curtis asked the male how he would get his billfold back. The male told Curtis that he would drop it off at the front desk of the hotel lobby after he received the money. Curtis said all the incoming calls from the suspect on his Blackberry showed as restricted numbers.

Lt. McGovern contacted SIU personnel to conduct surveillance on the specific flower pot on the Washington St. Bridge. Surveillance personnel were also supplied with Washington license number [REDACTED] which returned to a [REDACTED]

At 1212 hours a male called Curtis' cell phone number again, telling Curtis he should have had plenty of time to get the money. I directed Curtis to stall the male, giving surveillance units time to set up. I heard the male tell Curtis that he was going to have a friend pick up the money. After he received his money the billfold would be dropped off at the hotel. Curtis said the incoming phone calls showed restricted.

At 1237 hours Lt. McGovern advised me that surveillance personnel were set up and ready for the victim to drop an envelope off on the bridge. I followed Curtis to his vehicle and told him to drive directly to the north end of the bridge where he would be under surveillance. I told Curtis to drop the envelope off, return to his car and drive directly back to the hotel.

At 1242 hours Curtis called me on my cell phone. He told me that he saw the first white male walking south bound on the north end of the Washington St. Bridge toward the park. He said the male was wearing a white colored baseball shirt but he could not describe the clothing further. I immediately phoned Lt. McGovern so he could advise surveillance personnel. Lt. McGovern also advised me that Curtis had already dropped off the envelope and was driving back south bound in his white Honda.

I called Curtis back and he confirmed he had already dropped off the envelope and he last saw the male walking through the park. I told Curtis to immediately drive back to his hotel.

Once Curtis returned to the hotel, we went back to room 968 and I continued to interview him. I read a search consent card to him, which he stated he understood and signed. Curtis did supply me with a buccal swab/DNA sample in case it was needed at a later date. Curtis used a buccal swab applicator to swab the inside of his cheeks, allowing me to collect two samples.

I asked Curtis what physical evidence would be in the hotel room which would link the suspect to the hotel room. Curtis pointed out a Propel fitness water bottle in the garbage, a condom wrapper in the garbage and a used condom in the garbage. I photographed the room and the items prior to their collection. I also collected the sheets and pillow cases from the bed.

While I was collecting evidence I saw a plastic sack which contained a light grey length of nylon rope, a plastic doctor's stethoscope and other items I could not

immediately identify. Curtis told me they had nothing to do with the sex act and the suspect had not handled them. Curtis said he did not want to show me those items in the sack. I did not view the items further because Curtis said they had nothing to do with the case.

The pillow cases, sheets, Propel bottle, condom and condom wrapper were ultimately placed onto the property book as evidence.

I contacted hotel security officer John Clarke. I told Clarke that I had collected the sheets and pillow cases from #968 as evidence and the occupant of the room was the reported victim of a crime.

I was contacted by Lt. McGovern, who advised me that surveillance personnel had detained a white male who had picked the envelope up on the north end of the Washington St. Bridge. I drove Curtis to the north end of the bridge in my vehicle for a show up. I told him the person detained may or may not be involved in the incident. I asked him if he recognized that person as anyone he had seen reference this incident. Curtis looked at the male, who was later identified as Brandon Burchell. Curtis stated he had never seen the male before. I transported Curtis back to the hotel and returned to the Public Safety Building to question Burchell.

I arrived at the Public Safety Building where Brandon Dean Burchell was [REDACTED] in an interview room in the Major Crimes Unit. [REDACTED] I told him that I was investigating an extortion complaint and that I wanted to talk to him and get his side of the story. [REDACTED] I told him he did not have to talk to me if he didn't want to, he could pick and choose what he wanted to say and he could stop talking to me at any point in time. I asked him if he had ever [REDACTED] and Burchell said he had. [REDACTED]

Burchell said his name was Brandon Dean Burchell, [REDACTED]/83, and he lived at [REDACTED] His personal cell number is [REDACTED] The service carrier is TMobile.

Burchell first told me that a male he only knew as "Stallion" asked him to pick an envelope up which would be in the flower pot on the north end of the Washington St. Bridge. Burchell had never seen Stallion before and only talked to him over chat lines on the telephone. I told Burchell I did not believe him and what he was telling me was not credible. Burchell then told me [REDACTED] called Burchell who was using Joey Castagna's cell number [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was calling from his own cell phone. [REDACTED] told Burchell to go to the north end of the Washington St. Bridge and pick up an envelope which a guy would be dropping off in the flower pot. Burchell figured something illegal was going on, but he did not know what. Burchell believed [REDACTED] would give him money for picking up the envelope. Burchell walked along North River Dr from Division, west bound to Washington, south on Washington, saw the envelope and when he picked it up [REDACTED]. Burchell told me he was not going down for [REDACTED] or Joey and that this was all he knew.

Burchell said [REDACTED] cell number was [REDACTED] [REDACTED] lives [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Deena Castagna, who has cell number [REDACTED] and Deena's husband, John Rohrbach. Burchell said [REDACTED] drives a [REDACTED]

I told Burchell I wanted to verify his story. When Burchell [REDACTED] he possessed a cell phone, [REDACTED] I told him I would like to turn the phone on an review the phone call history. He could require me to obtain a search warrant, or he could give me his permission. I read a search consent waiver card to Burchell and allowed him to read it also. Burchell signed the search consent waiver card at 1434 hours.

Burchell's cell phone showed that he had received a phone call from "Joey", [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at 1352 hours on 10/26/07.

I told Burchell that he was going to be detained while I attempted to locate [REDACTED] and Joey Castagna.

I left a message for Deena Castagna on her cell number [REDACTED]. I identified myself and asked her to have [REDACTED] contact me as soon as possible.

On 10/26/07 Lt. Dave McGovern and I were driving to [REDACTED] to attempt to contact [REDACTED]. While enroute I received a telephone call from [REDACTED] who was with [REDACTED] Deena. [REDACTED] agreed to meet me. Lt. McGovern and I met [REDACTED] and Deena Castagna on Electric Ave. in Four Lakes. I told both Deena and [REDACTED] that I was not going to arrest [REDACTED] at that time. I told them that the victim told me he only wanted his property back. [REDACTED] was crying and told me that "he humiliated me."

I told [REDACTED] that I wanted to get his side of the story, that he was not under arrest and that he did not have to talk to me if he didn't want to. That if he talked to me it would be voluntary, he could stop at any time, he could refuse to answer any question and he could even pick and choose what he wanted to say. I told [REDACTED] when I was done talking to him I was not going to arrest him at that time and that the victim just wanted his property back.

[REDACTED] identified himself as [REDACTED]. He lives at [REDACTED] and his cell phone carrier is Cricket.

[REDACTED] stated that on 10/26/07 at approximately 0100 hours he was at an adult bookstore in the Spokane Valley, watching porno movies. A white male with glasses and grey hair, wearing a brown leather jacket, came up to him and asked him if he wanted to hang out. The male gave [REDACTED] a cigarette and his phone number. [REDACTED] said he only knew the male as Richard. Richard left and [REDACTED] later called Richard on Richard's cell phone, which was a long distance phone number. [REDACTED] met Richard at the Davenport Hotel and agreed to go up to Richard's room. Richard gave [REDACTED] \$100 for gas and they agreed to have sex.

[REDACTED] stated Richard was a "freak." [REDACTED] said that Richard dressed in women's lingerie during sex. [REDACTED] said he [REDACTED] used a condom and performed anal intercourse on Richard while they were in Richard's bed. After the sex act was completed Richard told [REDACTED] he wanted to perform "bareback sex" on [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] stated that bareback sex is unprotected anal intercourse. Richard wanted to perform anal intercourse on [REDACTED] and told [REDACTED] he did not like the feel of condoms. [REDACTED] told Richard that he did not do that, that he didn't know Richard

and that "bareback sex" was unsafe sex and was dangerous. Richard asked [REDACTED] "what would it take for you to do it."

Richard asked [REDACTED] if he would let Richard perform bareback sex on [REDACTED] for \$1,000. [REDACTED] agreed and Richard performed unprotected anal sex on [REDACTED] Richard fell asleep after the intercourse. [REDACTED] woke Richard up and asked him about the money Richard promised [REDACTED] Richard stated he did not have any more money and could not get it at that hour. [REDACTED] asked Richard for collateral and Richard gave [REDACTED] his billfold to hold until he received the rest of his money. [REDACTED] left the Davenport with the billfold.

[REDACTED] said he called Richard at about 0645 hours and asked for the rest of his money. Richard said he didn't have any more money to give him. [REDACTED] admitted he had called Richard and told him to put the rest of the money in an envelope and leave it on the bridge. [REDACTED] would give Richard his billfold back after [REDACTED] got the rest of his money.

[REDACTED] said after he found out that Brandon Burchell [REDACTED] he gave Richard's billfold to a black male known to him only as Kalani (unknown spelling.) [REDACTED] stated Kalani had been at [REDACTED] This is the residence of [REDACTED] Mike Castagna. The billfold was placed in a purple and peach colored gift bag. He gave it to Kalani to get rid of. [REDACTED] admitted he had looked through the billfold and saw that Richard had identification which said he was a member of Congress or something.

[REDACTED] continually cried and said that he believed Richard had tricked him and never intended to pay him the thousand dollars for unprotected sex.

[REDACTED] told me Kalani had called [REDACTED] and told [REDACTED] that the billfold was hidden in a dumpster at Augusta/Wall.
